... of your child with a disability, that is. **Woodbine House is looking for photographs of children, teens, and adults with autism spectrum disorders, Down syndrome, Tourette syndrome, cerebral palsy, spina bifida, AD/HD, visual impairments, and more** to use in several books that we plan to publish within the next 1-5 years.

We need photos of children and adults with special needs:

- engaged in any daily activities and self-help skills (eating, bathing, playing, taking first steps, sleeping, reading, doing homework, shaving, doing chores, working, participating in early intervention or school)
- undergoing medical tests or procedures
- socializing with parents, grandparents, siblings, friends (playing games, dancing, expressing affection, dating, attending parties, just hanging out)
- engaged in communication (talking, using AAC, using gestures or sign, using PECS, working with a speech therapist, writing, using a computer)
- engaged in self-stimulatory behaviors, rituals, tics, aggression, and challenging behaviors
- engaged in occupational therapy or sensory integration therapy (bouncing, brushing, squeezing, games involving coordination, etc.)
- participating in treatment and educational programs
- Working with professionals (SLPs, OTs, PTs, resource teachers, paraprofessionals, classroom teachers, etc.)

To submit photos for possible inclusion in an upcoming book:

- Send as many photos as you'd like to: Woodbine House, Special Needs Photos, 6510 Bells Mill Rd., Bethesda, MD 20817.
- Send in the mail color or B&W prints that are sharply focused. CD-ROMS with digital images in JPEG or TIF format are also acceptable, as long as they are at least 300 dpi. Please do not send slides, digital prints, or email attachments.
- Do not email us your photos.
- Label the back of each photo with your child's name, address, and age at the time the photo was taken. (A return address sticker works well.)
- **Do not send irreplaceable photos!** Keep the negative or a copy of all photos you send us. Photos will *not* be returned.
- Include a photo release form for each identifiable person who appears in the photos you send. You may use the same form for yourself and all your children. If children other than your own appear in a photo, their parents need to fill out and sign a separate release form. Teachers or other adults (over 18) shown in photos should also sign release forms.
